SAC

On January 9, 2024 the School Accountability Committee met to discuss staffing, class size, and budget. Those three topics are tightly related. I started to present some research about class size and ultimately said that we can find any research study that defends whichever side of the issue you believe in, therefore, our conversation needs to be more about our values and how we can use our resources to align to values. The commonality I heard in the parents' shares is that they want strong relationships between their student, teacher, and the family. There is a consideration that it is difficult to have the time to build those strong relationships as the class size increases. As principal, I agree with that sentiment. That obviously ties to staffing because we will have to make adjustments overall to uphold our value of strong relationships with the teacher, student, and family. Thank you for sharing. I will update you all on budget in early February. Our next SAC meeting is at Dakota Ridge High School with the area schools on February 5 at 6 pm. Always feel free to submit your thoughts that you'd like discussed at SAC using this form.

Previous submissions:

- -Can we paint the exterior doors? Yep! This is planned for spring break.
- -We would like to discuss communication standards from teachers to families. It is so important to Westridge staff that families feel connected. Please express your desire to your child's classroom teacher and I know they will want to work on a plan for better communication with you if it's not working currently. We are willing to compromise on a system that works for teacher and family:)
- -I want to talk about the math curriculum. I bet you're not the only one! That is why we are hosting a math night (see invite below)

Grub Club

In 2015, there were more than 2,400 students in Jeffco Schools who didn't have a permanent home or a hot meal to go home to at night. As educators we know this affects their ability to perform in the classroom, and as human beings we know what this can do to a student's spirit. Every spring, we lead Grub Club in order to ensure all students experiencing homelessness or emancipation in Jeffco can have food and hygiene products throughout the school year.

Grub Club 2024

JCEA, JESPA, and Jeffco PTA are partnering again with the Jeffco Action Center now through March 8, 2024 to help ensure our students have food. We have expanded our collection of items through monetary donations. A \$25 donation fills 1/4 of a box of goods. Any monetary donations helps fill a box for a student in need.





-To date, Westridge has recycled over 845 pounds of trash!


